Friday May the 11/1804

The Council met Present His Excellency the Governor and The honorable Allen. B. Buckitt, Purveyor, Ghislerin and Edward Hall.

The Governor and Council have this day sold to George McFauland twenty acres of land lying in Harford County, it being the same land heretofore sold to Samuel Aikin and taken back by the Executive. Mr. McFauland is to have the land surveyed by the Surveyor of the County at his own expense and upon the return of the Surveyor's Certificate a Deed of Conveyance will be executed for the State's right to the said land. The said George McFauland having this day paid into the Treasurer of the Western Shore the purchase Money for the same amounting to the sum of eight pounds nine shillings and seven pence.

James Clayland was appointed an Associate Justice for Queen Anne's County vice Jonathan Broady resigned, and Commission issued to Robert Emory and James Clayland Junior as Associate Justices of Queen Anne's County.

William Duncan was appointed a Justice of the Peace for Baltimore County vice William S. Moore removed, and a new Commission issued including him and leaving out William S. Moore.
