Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John Guinn, Esquire Clerk of the General Court the sum of two hundred and fifty one pounds and three pence current Money for transcribing Old Records in virtue of a Resolution of the General Assembly passed at November Session 1790 and an agreement with the Governor and Council entered into the year 1791.

Thursday October the 11/1804

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and The honorable Allen B. Duckett, Francis Digger and Edward Hall.

On application of Peter Mantz of Frederick County for a preference in the purchase of a small piece of Land being part of a Tract of Land called Fishers Chance late the property of Daniel Dulany Son of Daniel beginning for said piece of Land at the beginning of George Snidder's lot of Land and running thence South eleven bequas East sixteen and one quarter Perches South sixty four and one half bequas West thirteen Perches North six bequas East then Perches North forty four bequas West two perches North sixty four and one half bequas West nine Perches North seven bequas West fourteen and one half Perches then by a straight line to the beginning containing ninety seven square Perches of Land which is said to be liable to confiscation. The Board agreed to
