

Whereas Isaac Martin a fugitive from Justice from the Commonwealth of Virginia confined in the Jail of Baltimore County charged with having murdered Aza Lupton an Infant about three Years of Age and with having barbarously wounded two other Children viz Peggy and Ruth Lupton with an intent to murder them, has been demanded by the Governor of the aforesaid Commonwealth to be delivered up agreeably to the Constitution and Laws of the United States. Ordered, that the Sheriff of Baltimore County be directed to deliver up the said Isaac Martin to Charles Fizzle the Agent on the part of the said Commonwealth to receive and conduct him to the County of Hampshire in the State of Virginia for trial.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. Jubb Fowler twenty nine pounds thirteen Shillings and nine pence for one quarter's Salary as Mesenger of the Council due first Instant.

Ordered, that the said Treasurer pay to Merian Penhony Twenty five pounds for one quarter's Salary as Clerk of the Council due as above.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore credit Philip Hey of Saint Marys County by the Sum of twenty four pounds eight Shillings principal, being part of the amount included in his Bond as agent in the hands of Elizabeth N. Cartwright Adm. inistratrix of John Cartwright, allowing an Interest on said Sum from 26 May 1797 to 20 November 1804 the time to which Interest was charged said Hey and included in his Bond aforesaid.
