The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the court of the said County do remit the said fine.

By the Petition of Joseph Watters of Anne Arundel County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the court of the said County it appears that he was presented at Anne Arundel County Court at September Term 1799 in two presentments for selling spirituous liquor without license and was fined by the said court at April Term 1805 in each case the sum of three pounds amounting in the whole to the sum of six pounds. The Petitioner states that during the sitting of Anne Arundel County Court for April Term 1799 he was unable to attend the court, and believing that Retailers license might have been obtained without his personal appearance in court, he lodged in the hands of Mr. Joseph Harwood Money to pay for his license. that Mr. Harwood made application to the court accordingly, and that they refused to grant license unless the person for whom it was to be obtained was personally in court. The Petitioner states that he did not know for a considerable time after the rising of the court, that license had been refused to him, otherwise he would not have violated the law of the State. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the court of the said County do remit the said fine.

By the Petition of Richard R. Rawlings of Anne Arundel County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the court of the said County it appears that he was presented at April Term 1804 in two several presentments for selling spirituous liquor without license and was fined by the court of the said County at April Term 1805 the sum of three pounds in each. The Petitioner states that he took possession of the place called and known by the name of Rawlings Tavern in the Winter preceding the Term to which he was presented, and subsequent to the rising of Anne Arundel County Court. That he was informed and did believe that he might commence Tavern keeping in the City of the court without taking out license, and that at the meeting of the next court he should then have to pay for the time that he had kept Tavern. He states that his violating of the law proceeded entirely from misinformation and misconception of the law, and not from any Motive of wading the same. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the court of the said County do remit the said fine.
