Saturday December the 6. 1806

The Council met Present The Honble Reverdy G. Chiselin Thomas W. Hall and James Nabb. d. Duwall By the Petition of David Poe Juror of Cecil County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that he was fined by the said Court at a full Term last the Sum of six pounds for selling spirituous liquors without licence. The Petitioner states that when he commenced retailing liquors in Cecil County, he had only then returned to this State, from which he had been absent several years, and that he was utterly ignorant of any provisions of any Act of Assembly of this State that rendered it necessary for a person to take out a licence to sell liquor. That being desirous of informing himself he accordingly inquired of Neighbour of his a Gentleman who had been for a number of years engaged in the retailing business whether it was necessary for him to take out a licence and that the gentleman probably misunderstanding the question thought it related to the late Excise law which had about that time been repealed informed the petitioner that it was not. That his not taking out a licence was owing entirely to his misinformation and not to any inclination or intention of violating the laws of this State. That as soon as he discovered his error, he immediately took out a Permit and has continued ever since to receive permits from the Court. The Board on consideration of the circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said fine.
