

By the Petition of Gottlieb J. Grammer of Anne Arundel County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that he was fined at September Term last in three several instances the sum of six pounds Current Money each. The Petitioner states that he was confined during the whole of last Summer in the County Goal of Anne Arundel for Debt and was obliged to take the benefit of the Insolvent Law, before he was released from confinement. That he has given up all his property for the benefit of his Creditors, and is utterly unable to pay the said fines. That he has a family which depend upon his exertions for daily support, and which will be reduced to great distress should he be committed to Jail for the non payment of said fines. The Board on consideration of the circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the whole of the said fines except five pounds.

By the Petition of Leonard Emmon of Prince Georges County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that he was fined at April Term last in two instances for selling liquors without license the sum of six pounds Current Money in each case. The Petitioner states that he had been long engaged in the retail Trade for the support of himself and a numerous family and had always punctually taken out a license, but on the abolition of the late Judiciary System he applied to Thomas Comte Esquire, formerly one of the Associate Justices who was empowered by law to grant Permits for such purposes during the recess of the County Court and was informed by said Comte that he had not the power to act and he believed the Chief Justice had no power likewise and was not informed to what source to apply. The Petitioner further states that as soon as he received the necessary information he took the first opportunity of taking out a license under which he now does and except in the instance mentioned always did carry on his business. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said fines.
