Monday March the 25. 1811

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and all the Council.

The Board proceeded to elect a Chief Judge for the first Judicial District of Maryland to supply the vacancy occasioned by the death of the Honorable John M. Gantt. The Ballots being deposited in the Ballot Box. on examination thereof it appeared that John Johnson Esquire was appointed. Whereupon it is declared in the Council that the said John Johnson is duly elected Chief Judge of the first Judicial District of Maryland. Ordered that Commission issue. Commission issued to him accordingly.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John Brewwell Esquire Sheriff of Cecil County the sum of seventy three Dollars and eighty two cents in full of his expences and a Allowance for bringing from the State of Pennsylvania David M'Bann a fugitive from Justice as per account passed.
