That the Witness on the part of the State, has never been in Court, which has caused the case to be yet pending before the Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the whole of the said forfeiture.

By the Petition of Hiram Bett and Oliver Sutt of Prince Georges County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that they entered into a Recognizance the first in the sum of one hundred Dollars and the last in the sum of fifty Dollars for the appearance of the said Hiram Bett at Prince Georges County Court at September Term eighteen hundred and nine on the oath of the Peace of a certain Henry Jones. The Petitioners state (and the same is confirmed by the Certificate of Doctor Alexander M. Williams) that during the time of the Session of the said Court in September eighteen hundred and nine the Petitioner Hiram Bett was confined by sickness and rendered wholly unable to attend the said Court according to the tenor of said Recognizance. The Board on consideration of the circumstances of the case and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the whole of said forfeitures.

By the Petition of Joseph N. Stevens of Charles County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that he was fined at March Term eighteen hundred and eleven in four cases the sum of six pounds Current Money in each case for selling Spirituous liquors without licence. The Petitioner states that he has been a retailer of Spirituous liquors for several years past. That he uniformly took out licence at the August Term. That at August Term eighteen hundred and nine he as usual applied for a licence gave his Securities and paid the price. That he was not entered on the list of licenced Retailers by the Clerk from omission. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the whole of the said fines.

By the Petition of Leonard Hedwell of Prince Georges County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that his son Jonas Hedwell was fined by the said Court at April Term eighteen hundred and nine in five cases the sum of six pounds Current Money in each case for selling Spirituous liquors without licence. The Petitioner states that the said Jonas Hedwell not being able to pay the above mentioned fines was thrown into confinement and he having become security for said Jonas Hedwell upon being released from Prison is now liable to the Sheriff for the same. The Petitioner states that when he became security he was led to believe that the fines and fees were paid.
