John Brewer Esquire was appointed Register of the Land Office for the Western Shore in the room of John Kelly Esquire deceased and Commission issued to him accordingly.

Colonel John LaSaway was appointed Adjutant General of the Militia of the State of Maryland in the room of John Kelly deceased and Commission issued to him accordingly.

By the Petition of William Haynes it appears that he was fined at Talbot County Court at November Term last in two cases the quantity of two thousand pounds of Tobacco in each case for selling spirituous liquor on a Sunday. The Petitioner states that he was formerly a House Keeper and Retailer of spirituous liquors in the Town of Easton and was duly licenced as such. that in the fall of the year eighteen hundred and four and during the extreme indisposition of his Wife, on whom his duty and affections led him generally to attend, a certain Benjamin Ayres assisted him in the management of his Shop, and waited upon his customers. that on a certain Sunday two persons of the said Town called at his House to purchase some spirituous liquor alleging that they were wanted for the use of the rich - and that the said Ayres incautiously giving heed to these allegations did sell the liquor to the persons applying. The Petitioner states that from having little or no Capital to trade on, from some losses which he met with and from bodily infirmity with which he has been afflicted almost from his infancy, he is rendered wholly unable to pay the fines. that such has been his unfortunate situation that he has been compelled to petition the Judges of Talbot County Court for the benefit of the Insolvent Law without being able to obtain the same to any effect on account of the said fines. The Board on consideration of which circumstances and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County do remit the said fines amounting in the whole to the sum of twenty five pounds.
