By the Petition of Isaac Franklin and John Darnall of Prince Georges County accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said County it appears that they entered into a Recognizance in the sum of one hundred Pounds for the appearance of the said Isaac Franklin at the said Court at April Term eighteen hundred and eleven and that he should produce to the said Court a certain Rezin Ogleton who had petitioned against him for his freedom. The Petitioners state that in September Term last the case between the said Isaac Franklin and Rezin Ogleton came on for trial and that the Counsel for the said Ogleton having failed to produce any testimony to satisfy the Jury that the said Ogleton was entitled to freedom when the Jury which was charged with the case returned the Counsel for the said Ogden refused to answer, but made default and the said case was non prosed.
