James Madison President of the United States of America. To all whom it may concern. Henry Aquilon Enquire having produced to me his commission as Consul of his Majesty the King of Sweden for the Port of Baltimore. I do hereby recognize him as such, and declare him free to exercise such functions, powers and privileges, as are allowed within the United States to the Consuls of friendly powers between whom and the United States there is no agreement for the regulation of the consular functions. In Testimony whereof I have caused these letters to be made patent and the Seal of the States to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand at the City of Washington, the second day of March Anno Domini eighteen hundred and twelve, and of the Independence of the United States of America the thirty sixth.
