A Proclamation

Whereas it has been stated to me that Lewis E. Mackall has lately lost two houses by fire and that he has reason to suspect that some wicked and evil disposed person set fire to the same. And Whereas it is highly important that all offenders against the laws and peace of Society should be brought to justice. I have thought proper to give this my Proclamation and do by and with the advice and consent of the Council offer a Reward of one hundred Dollars to any person who shall discover and make known the Author or perpetrator of said offence provided he or they or any of them be brought to justice; and I do further in virtue of the powers vested in me by Law offer a full and free pardon to any person being an accomplice who shall discover the perpetrator or perpetrators of the said crime on the above said condition. Given under my hand and the Seal of the State of Maryland at the City of Annapolis this fourteenth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twelve.
