Thursday August the 20/1812

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honorable John Stephen Thomas W. Hall and Reverdy G. Hiseelin.

Ordered that the Armourer at Annapolis deliver to Captain Samuel Moore two six pound Iron Field Pieces with the necessary apparatus for the use of the Artillery Company commanded by him.

Ordered that the Executive will lease to Captain Edward G. Woodyear for the use of his Artillery Company the two Field Pieces that have lately been cast by Henry Foxall and the said Woodyear is authorized to cause the said Cannon to be mounted in Baltimore on terms consistent with proper economy.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to His Excellency Robert Bowie thirty seven Dollars and fifty cents to reimburse so much Money advanced by him for the State in payment for the transportation of one hundred Tents from the Arsenal at Frederick Town.

Friday August the 21/1812

The Council met. Present His Excellency the Governor and The Honorable John Stephen Thomas W. Hall, Reverdy G. Hiseelin and James Mabb.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. David Hanson thirty Dollars and fifty eight cents for riding Expise as per Account passed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Messieurs Cornthwaite and Carey five hundred and ten Dollars and seventeen and a half cents for Storage on Public Arms as per Account passed by the Auditor General.

Ordered that the Armourer at Annapolis deliver to Captain John Hall thirty Swords and thirty Pistols for the use of the Troop of Horse commanded by him.

By the Petition of Jonathan Basen accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of Kent County it appears that he was fined at this Term last twenty Dollars for an Assault and Battery on the body of Samuel
