Ordered, that John Chandler Esquire be employed to print four hundred copies of the Election laws for the use of the Judges of Elections in the several Election Districts in this State & that they be then printed distributed in the following manner viz, 39 for the City of Baltimore, Six for the City of Annapolis, Three for St. Marys County, & Twelve for the Judges of Elections, Three for Charles County and Twelve for the Judges of Elections, Three for Prince Georges County and Eighteen for the Judges of Elections, Three for Montgomery County and Fifteen for the Judges of Elections, Three for Washington County and Fifteen for the Judges of Elections, Three for Frederick County and Twenty seven for the Judges of Elections, Three for Allegany County and Twenty four for the Judges of Elections, Three for Calvert County and nine for the Judges of Elections, Three for Anne Arundel County and Fifteen for the Judges of Elections, Three for Baltimore County and Twenty one for the Judges of Elections, Three for Harford County and Fifteen for the Judges of Elections, Three for Kent County and Nine for the Judges of Elections, Three for Caroline County and Nine for the Judges of Elections, Three for Cecil County and Twelve for the Judges of Elections, Three for Queen Annes County and Nine for the Judges of Elections, Three for Talbot County and Twelve for the Judges of Elections, Three for Dorchester County and Fifteen for the Judges of Elections, Three for Worcester County and Fifteen for the Judges of Elections, Three for Somerset County and Nine for the Judges of Elections.

Ordered that the act repealing all that part of the constitution as relates to the division of Washington County into five election Districts be published in each of the papers in Hagerstown once a week for six weeks.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. John Shaw twenty six dollars and sixty eight cents for taking an Inventory of the furniture in the Government House as follows
