

In Council Annapolis March 22^d 1820

The Governor and Council took into consideration the Resolution of the General Assembly passed at its last session authorising them to examine into the claim of Richard Lockerman Esquire, against the State for services rendered in passing the books of the Auditor and which ought to have been done by his predecessor in office, and allow him a fair compensation for the same, and did after a full examination of the Books and papers that were laid before them by the said Lockerman adjudge and determine that the said Lockerman be allowed and paid the sum of one hundred dollars for his services aforesaid. Therefore ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Richard Lockerman the sum of one hundred dollars.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John Chandler Esquire two hundred and ten dollars for stationary and for printing &c as per account passed and filed.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Samuel Barnes six dollars and fifty cents for printing &c as per account passed & filed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to George Shaw Esquire twenty nine dollars and twelve and a half cents for stationary &c as per account passed and filed.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to George Shaw Esquire four hundred and two dollars for binding four hundred and two volumes of the new edition of the Laws of Maryland as per account passed & filed.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mr. John Shaw late Armourer at Annapolis ninety nine dollars and thirty eight and a half cents for salary to the twentieth of January 1820 & for other services as per account passed and filed.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Henry Thompson thirty dollars for riding express with death warrants as per account passed and filed.
