It is therefore ordered and directed that the said Robert Lewis be released from the said fine of sixteen dollars

By the Petition of Heil Peck of Prince Georges County it appears that he is a licensed Tavern keeper residing in the Town of Bladensburg and has constantly kept an orderly Tavern endeavouring as far as in his power to comply with the laws of the State, and in his charges with the rates specified by the Court of Prince Georges County - That during his absence from the Tavern his bar keeper in two instances charged twenty five cents instead of twenty cents for a half pint of whiskey for which he was presented by the Grand Jury of the said County at September Term 1819. That at April Term ensuing he submitted his case to the Court and was fined the sum of five dollars in each case. The Court and a number of respectable persons inhabitants of the said County having recommended a remission of the said fines. The Executive do order and direct that the said Heil Peck be released from the said fines.
