By the Petition of Doctor Anderson Warfield of the city
of Baltimore it appears that on the thirteenth of December last, he was
requested by William Ashman a Justice of the Peace for Baltimore
County to state what knowledge he had respecting an assault and battery
committed on a negro man by the name of Samuel Williams by a white
man named Dominick. The Petitioner states that he visited said Williams
the day after he received a wound, which said Williams stated had been
inflicted by a white man named Dominick, and which circumstance he
stated to the Justice of the Peace - that he was not present at the affray
and that he did not know the Parties - that he is called upon to pay
the sum of sixty dollars the amount of a forfeited recognizance due the
State of Maryland for not appearing at Baltimore County Court at
March Term last as an evidence against said Dominick. The said
Warfield states that he did not know he was recognized or he would
certainly have appeared at Court. The said statements having been
sworn to by said Warfield, the Board do on the recommendation of the
Court of the said County remit the said forfeiture of sixty dollars.
