

By the Petition of David C. Case of the City of Baltimore, accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said City, it appears that he was fined by the said Court at June term last, the sum of twenty dollars, and to undergo a confinement for the space of six months for assaulting and beating Mary Carey. The Petitioner states he has already been confined in the Jail of Baltimore City for the term of six months, and is still in confinement on account of his inability to pay the said fine. That he is sincerely penitent for his offence. The Board do on the recommendation of the said Court remit the said fine of twenty dollars.

In Council Annapolis December the 20th 1890

Whereas the Executive did on the second day of November eighteen hundred and twenty, agree to receive from the General Government eleven cannon together with the Equipments at five hundred dollars each, to be considered as a part of the Quota of Arms due from the United States to this State, under and in virtue of an Act of Congress passed on the twenty third of April eighteen hundred and eight, for supplying the Militia of the United States with arms - provided the same should pass inspection - And it having been reported to this Department that the said Cannon and Equipments were not received in consequence of the carriages not being considered as made in a workmanlike manner. And it appearing from a letter lately filed in the Executive Chamber written by G. Burnford Lieutenant Colonel of Ordnance that the United States Government offers to furnish the State with the said Cannon, Carriages and all the Equipments, Harness for Horses &c. at four hundred dollars each, and agree to authorize the Executive to employ some person to mount the Cannon should the same be preferred by the State Authority, and that they will allow the State two hundred and twenty dollars for each of the carriages - and that the same Cannon when mounted together with the Equipments shall be considered as a part of the Quota of Arms due this State from the United States.

Ordered, that the Governor and Council assent to said proposition, and Colonel Matthew McCaughlin for whose Artillery Regiment they are intended, be and he is hereby authorized to cause the said Carriages to be made in such manner as he may deem most likely to promote the interest of the State.
