Ordered, that Major William Stansbury, of the City of Baltimore,
be and he is hereby authorized to call on the General Government and receive
from it six hundred Rifles to be deducted from the Quota of Arms due the said
State under the provisions of an act of Congress passed on the 23 of April 1809,
Entitled, an act making provision for arming and equipping the whole Body
of the Militia of the United States.

Ordered, that the six hundred Rifles, which Major William
Stansbury is authorized to receive from the General Government by order of this
date, when received shall be kept for the use of the Battalion under his command,
on his giving bond and security for their safe return in good order when
called for. It is further Ordered, that he send to the Armory at this place
the four hundred Rifles that he received from the General Government in April
1822 and the 75 of those that were loaned to him 1818 for the use of his Bat-
talion, that remain in his possession -

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Jeremiah
Hughes Coquire, five hundred dollars, in part compensation for printing the Laws
and Notes and proceedings of the General Assembly, passed at December session
1822 to be accounted for on the completion of the said work -
