

By the Petition of Henry Wier of Baltimore County it appears that he was fined by the said Court at March Term 1822 in two cases the sum of one hundred dollars, in each case, for selling foreign goods without license - The Petitioner states that when he sold the said goods he was not aware that it was necessary for him to take out license - that the value of the goods in his store never did exceed fifty dollars including groceries, that he has a large family dependant on him for support - that his situation will not enable him to discharge the fines - and that he is now in the custody of the Sheriff - and the said case having been represented to be by a number of highly respectable persons of the said County as proper for Executive relief - The Board do on the recommendation of the Court of the said County remit so much of the said fines as the State is entitled to -
