By order of His Excellency the Governor, the following writ was issued. The State of Maryland to the Sheriff of Baltimore County, Greeting, Whereas it has been represented to the Executive of this State, by the Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, that a certain George Tharp who had been indicted by the Grand Jury of Adams County in the said Commonwealth for kidnapping a certain Mulatto woman named Mabel Cox, otherwise called Marabella Cox, and a certain Mulatto Girl named Harriett, a copy of which indictment has been forwarded to me, duly authenticated, has fled from the justice of said Commonwealth, and is believed to reside now in the City of Baltimore, and His Excellency J. Andrew Shulze Governor of the said Commonwealth hath in pursuance of the Constitution and Law of the United States demanded the said George Tharp as a fugitive from justice. You are therefore hereby commanded to cause the said George Tharp to be apprehended, if he shall be found in your Bailiwick, and delivered to Mr. Philip Slentz, who has been duly appointed Agent to receive him, and to remove him to the said Commonwealth of Pennsylvania having jurisdiction of the crime with which he is charged - yours &c.
