mendation of the said Court remit the said fine of five hundred dollars.

By the Petition of William L. Bonine of the City of Baltimore, accompanied by
a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of the said City, it appears that he was
fined at November term eighteen hundred and twenty three the sum of five hundred
dollars for selling to John Essender one District Lottery Ticket No 9233 without license,
on the 6th Clasp of the Washington Monument Lottery, and that at February Term eighteen
hundred and twenty four, of the said Court he was fined the further sum of five hundred
dollars for opening, setting up, and keeping a certain office for selling Lottery Tickets, with-
out license. The Court state that from the examination of witnesses in open Court it
appeared that the said Bonine is now in jail for the fines of five hundred dollars each
incurred for violating the Act of Assembly passed in eighteen hundred and twenty one,
Chapter, two hundred and thirty, that he was in business as a Lottery Broker previous to
the passage of said Law, and has continued the same up to the present period, that he is
a very young man without friends capable of assisting him, and unable to pay the
said fines. That he has taken out a license under the Law dated the 1st of April last - in
Board do on consideration of which circumstances, and from the recommendation of the said
Court remit the said two fines of 500th each.
