

at Haver and Pedlar, from the Clerk of Queen Anne's County Court, for which he paid the sum of forty dollars, and the checks for thereon as required by law, that in August 1823, he settled at the Head of Sassafras in Kent County, and commenced store keeping by retailing dry goods, spirituous liquors and other groceries, believing that he had a right to do so under the license he had obtained, as a Haver and Pedlar, and which he had been informed by several persons he had a right to do. That as soon as he was informed that he was acting in violation of law, he immediately obtained the proper license to retail dry goods and spirituous liquors, at the Head of Sassafras - he prays to be released from said fines - The Board taking into consideration the circumstances attending these cases, do on the recommendation of the Court of the said County remit the said fine of sixteen dollars, and so much of the said fine of one hundred dollars as the State is entitled to.

Ordered that the Ammoures at Annapolis deliver to Captain Richard G. Hutton one Keg of Powder to fire a salute.

Ordered that the Ammoures at Annapolis deliver to Captain David Smith of Washington County, two six Pound Field Pieces, sixty new Artillery Swords, two Powder Horns, for the use of the Artillery Company commanded by him. The expense of transportation to be borne by said Smith.

Ordered that the Ammoures at Annapolis deliver to Captain John Contee of Prince Georges County, eighty Pistols, eighty Hangers, sixty swords and Belts, twenty Bullet moulds for the use of the Troop of Horse commanded by him. The expense of transportation to be borne by said Contee.
