

Ordered, that the Clerk of the Council, engage Roger B. Toney, Esquire, to aid the Attorney General, in arguing the case of the State in the Court of Appeals Alexander Brown at suit of the State, for not taking out a license as a Wholesale Merchant agreeably to Law.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Mrs Rebecca Forest, seventy dollars for one Quarters half pay, due the first Instant.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to General Perc Benson, sixty dollars for one Quarters half pay, due the 1st Instant.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John Brewer, Esquire, seventy five dollars for one Quarters salary as Clerk to the House of Delegates, due the first Instant.

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to William Kelly, Esquire, thirty seven dollars and fifty cents for one Quarters salary as Clerk to the Senate, due the first Instant.

By the Petition of Benjamin T. Pindle, of Anne Arundel County, it appears that he was fined by the Court of the said County, at April term 1824, the sum of sixteen dollars for selling spirituous liquors without license. The Petitioner states, that at the County Court preceding the commission of the offence he applied for a license to sell spirituous liquors, made a tender of the money for the said license, offered good and sufficient securities, but owing to the prep of business in Court, at the time, the Clerk could not issue the same. The Petitioner states that he was under the impression, and believed, the license had been granted, and that he was legally authorized to do the act for which he was fined, and that he had no intention to violate the law. The Board do on consideration of the circumstances of the case, and on the recommendation of the Court of the said County, remit the said fine of 16th.
