

a Transcript from the Proceedings of the Court of Anne Arundel County, it appears that he was fined in five cases, the sum of sixteen dollars in each case, for selling spirituous liquors without License. The Petitioner states that in making such sales, he was not aware that he was violating any Law of the Land, having received from Baltimore a few Demi Johns of Holland Gun, supposed to contain the quantity of five Gallons and a half each, and believing from the advice he had received, that he was authorized to sell without a License, he publicly offered for sale, and publicly sold the same. The Board do on consideration of which circumstances, and from the recommendation of the Court of the said County, remit the said five fines of sixteen dollars each.
