

By the Petition of Theodore Upton, Zadock M. Beall and William C. Jones &c.  
accompanied by a Transcript from the Proceedings of Prince Georges County Court it ap-  
pears that they entered into a Recognizance, Theodore Upton in the sum of fifty Pounds  
and Zadock M. Beall and William C. Jones in the sum of twenty five Pounds each for the  
appearance of the said Theodore Upton at Prince Georges County Court at September  
Term 1822 to answer a Presentment for an assault and Battery on the body of Rufell  
May and to keep the Peace &c. The Petitioners state that these things were complied with  
by Theodore Upton, that the said Rufell May did not appear against him, nor was any  
thing alleged against him for the assault and battery. Nevertheless to the surprise and  
great grievance of the Petitioners the Recognizance was from some mistake caused to be  
forfeited. The Board do on consideration of the circumstances of the case and from the  
recommendation of the Court remit the said forfeited Recognizances.

By the Petition of James Adams accompanied by a Transcript from the  
Proceedings of Baltimore County Court it appears that he was fined by said Court at  
March Term 1824 in two cases the sum of sixteen dollars in each case for selling spirituous  
liquors without license. The Petitioner states that he had taken out a license to sell liquor  
in one Tavern and afterwards moving to another Tavern continued to sell thinking  
his license justified his doing so, and not from any intention of violating the law.  
The Board do on consideration of which circumstance and from the recommendation  
the said Court remit the said fines.
