On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor, and by and with the advice and consent of the Council Frederick Wilson was appointed Register of Wills for Kent County until the next meeting of the General Assembly, vice Cuthbert Hall deceased, and commissions issued to him accordingly.

On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor, and by and with the advice and consent of the Council Timothy McNamara, William Dean and James Twilly were appointed Coroner for Dorchester County, and separate commissions issued to each accordingly.

By the Petition of Daniel W. Norris accompanied by a transcript from the Record of Baltimore City Court it appears that he was fined by said Court the sum of \$24 at February Term 1825 for selling liquor without license.
