Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Samuel Thomas or order seventy five dollars, for one quarters salary as Announcer at Easton due the first instant.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay John Brewer Esquire or order seventy five dollars for one quarters salary as clerk of the House of Delegates, due the first instant.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay William Nitty Esquire or order thirty seven dollar fifty Cents, for one quarters salary as Clerk of the Senate, due the first instant.

The following order was issued and sent to Colonel Howard of the 5<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Baltimore Volunteer Infantry, viz.

Order delivered to Col. Benjamin C Howard or order five hundred stands of muskets, in part of the sum due the State of Maryland under the act of Congress providing for arming the whole body of the Militia  
to Col. B. Howard Ordnance Department Washington.
