

By the petition of Francis Kattlingly of Prince Georges County, accompanied by a transcript from the Record of the County Court of said County, it appears, that he has been fined the sum of sixteen dollars for furnishing refreshments at a Vendue. The Petitioner states, that, he is a resident of Piscataway in the said County, where he keeps an ordinary and carries on the business of a baker, that sometimes in the year 1822 he was invited by Michael Mead, administrator of the late Mary A. Hearsy, to attend at her late residence during the sale of her property, with such refreshments as are usual on such occasions, which invitation he accepted, as it is a common practice for ordinary keepers to attend at Races, Muster & with refreshments, believing as he did that as he was already paying for the usual License granted to ordinary keepers, he was not violating any Law of the State. That while there his business was conducted in a peaceable and orderly manner, as himself can testify, he therefore prays for a remission of the said fine. And sundry citizens of Piscataway having stated that the facts as represented by the petitioners are true, and the Honble Edmund Key associate Judge of the said Court having recommended a remission of the said fine we do, hereby, remit the same.
