

November 23<sup>rd</sup> 1826

His Excellency the Governor, this day, granted a Pardon to certain James Philip, on account of two several Indictments pending against him in Baltimore City Court, charging him with "stealing" (See Pardon Record).

November 26<sup>th</sup> 1826

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to Francis Richmond on account of "a conspiracy with John Hammond to defraud a certain Rebecca Coe" of which he had been convicted, in Frederick County Court, at August Term last, and for which he was sentenced to two months imprisonment and to pay a fine of one hundred dollars, and to stand committed until the fine and fees are paid. The said Pardon granted upon condition of the fine and fees being paid. (See Pardon Record).

His Excellency the Governor, this day, granted a Pardon to John Hammond on account of a conspiracy with Francis Richmond to defraud a certain Rebecca Coe, of which he was convicted in Frederick County Court, at August Term last, and for which he was sentenced to two months imprisonment and to pay a fine of three hundred dollars, and to stand committed until the fine and fees are paid. The said Pardon granted upon condition of the fine and fees being paid. (See Pardon Record).

December 15<sup>th</sup> 1826

His Excellency the Governor, this day, granted a Pardon to Emanuel Hogan, on account of "stealing", of which he was convicted, in Baltimore City Court at November Term last, upon condition of his leaving the State without delay, and not returning again for several years. (See Pardon Record).

His Excellency the Governor, this day, granted a Pardon to George Hawn, on account of "House Stealing", of which he had been convicted, and for which he was sentenced to confinement in the Penitentiary. (See Pardon Record).
