

By the petition of Rezin Smoot of Charles County, accompanied by a transcript from the Records of the County Court of said County, it appears, that he entered into a recognizance in the sum of £50, with George Smoot and Theophilus Dent in the sum of £25 each as his securities for his appearance, at March Term 1825, before the said County Court, and for his good behavior to a certain Martha Smoot, &c, which said recognizance was entered forfeited. The Petitioner states, that the said Martha Smoot is his wife, and that an unfortunate difference having taken place between them, when he was in a state of intoxication, she took the oath of the peace against him, that he was committed to jail for want of security, that while there the said George Smoot and Theophilus Dent became his securities and he was released from confinement, that at the time of his release he was told by the Magistrate who took the recognizance, and also by his securities, that he had nothing to do but return home and keep the peace, particularly towards his said wife, that since the said time they have continued to live together peaceably and affectionately, that at the next Term of the Court, after entering into the said recognizance it was called, and he not appearing there to it was forfeited as aforesaid, that no presentment was found against him, nor did his wife appear against him, that he has a large family of children, several of whom are small and helpless, and that he is in indigent circumstances, that a Writ of Facias has been issued against the property of him and his securities to enforce payment of the said forfeiture, which if not arrested by the Executive will reduce his family to extreme poverty. He, therefore, prays that the said forfeiture may be remitted. And the said Court having recommended a compliance with the said prayer we do, hereby remit the same.
