

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay John B. Spencer or order one hundred and two dollars duty two and half Cents, Viz \$63.75 for publishing and providing for the public instruction of Youth in Primary Schools: \$3.87 1/2 for publishing acts proposing alterations in the Constitution, and \$7 for publishing Proclamation of Benjamin Beckmaster, from abroad.

Monday January 5 1827

This being the day appointed by the Constitution and Form of Government for the election of Governor, the General Assembly proceeded to said Election when His Excellency Joseph Kent was re-elected.

Tuesday January 6th 1827

This being the day appointed by the Constitution and Form of Government for the election of a Council to the Governor the General Assembly proceeded to said Election when Joseph Gabby, Williams Steward, Daniel Martin, Otho Scott, and Erund E. Innes Esquires, were duly Elected.

His Excellency Joseph Kent, re-elected Governor, appeared this day in the Senate Chamber and in the presence of both Houses of the General Assembly. There assembled, qualified by taking the Oaths prescribed by the Constitution and Laws of this State, and the Constitution of the United States, and subscribing a declaration of his belief in the Christian Religion. And thereupon His Excellency appeared in the Council Chamber.

Wednesday January 7th 1827

His Excellency the Governor this day attended in the Council Chamber.

Thursday January 8th 1827

His Excellency the Governor, this day attended in the Council Chamber.

William Steward and Daniel Martin Esquires, re-elected members of the Council appeared this day, and qualified before Gibson White Esquire, a Justice of the Peace for Anne Arundel County, by taking the Oaths prescribed by the Constitution and Laws of this State, and the Constitution of the United States, and by subscribing a declaration of their belief in the Christian Religion.

His Excellency the Governor, this day granted a Pardon to Littleton Boyman on account of a "Felony" for which he was convicted in Somerset County Court at September term last, and for which he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for two years.
