Joseph Gabby Esquire, re-elected a member of the Council, before taking his seat, qualified, before Joseph Mayo, Esquire, a Justice of the Peace for Sanduski County, by taking the Oath, prescribed by the Constitution and Laws of this State, and the Constitution of the United States, and subscribing a declaration of his belief in the Christian Religion.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore, pay Joseph Gabby Esq or order, one hundred and twenty five dollars, for one quarter's salary as a member of the Council due the first Instant.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore, pay His Excellency Joseph Kent, or order six hundred and sixty six dollars sixty seven cents for one quarter's salary as Governor, due the first Instant.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore, pay Robert H. Archer Esquire, or order, one hundred and twenty five dollars, for one quarter's salary as a member of the Council, due the first Instant.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Washington G. Tick or order, one hundred and twenty five dollars, for one quarter's salary as Armourer at Annapolis, due the first Instant.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore, pay John Brewer Esquire, or order, seventy five dollars for one quarter's salary as Clerk of the House of Delegates, due the first Instant.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay William Brown, of Berne, Esquire, or order, three hundred and fifty eight dollars twenty cents, for half year's salary as Examiner General (after deducting amount of fees received,) due the first Instant of amount.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Thomas R. Ham Esquire, or order, two hundred dollars, for one quarter's salary as
