

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore, pay Washington J. Tuck or order, two hundred and fifty dollars in account of repair of duty to be accounted for.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay John Brewer Esquire or order three hundred dollars, on account of Transcribing Land Records, under Resolution of the General Assembly.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore, pay Lazarus Sherman or order twenty six dollars sixty six cents for eight months pension due the first of October last.

The Council appointed Thomas Fullbroth Esquire their Clerk, who thereupon qualified as such, agreeably to the Constitution and Laws of this State, before Joseph Mayo Esquire a Justice of the peace of Anne Arundel County, and proceeded to act.

On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor and by and with the advice and consent of the Council, Henry Thompson was appointed Messenger of the Council, who thereupon qualified as such, agreeably to the Constitution and Laws of this State, before Joseph Mayo Esquire, a Justice of the peace of Anne Arundel County, and proceeded to act.

Singleton Durtal Esquire, who was appointed States agent for the Western Shore on the 25th day of October last, procured a Bond in the penalty of sixty thousand dollars for the faithful performance of his duty, signed by himself, and John Durtal, Lauch Durtal and Beall Durtal as his securities, which was examined by the board and approved, and ordered to be lodged with the Treasurer, as the Law directs.
