

Thursday March 27th 1827

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to a certain Lewis Hobbs for "stealing", of which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court. (See Pardon Record).

His Excellency also granted a Pardon to a certain Elijah Stone for "kidnapping", of which he had been convicted in three several cases, in Baltimore City Court, at November Term last. (See Pardon Record).

April 9th 1827

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to a certain Reuben Speckley (coloured man) for an assault and battery" of which he had been convicted in Baltimore City Court, at October Term last and for which he was sentenced to an imprisonment of three months, and to pay a fine of twenty dollars.

Upon application being made to his Excellency the Governor, stating that a certain man named Bob or Robert Slave of a certain Caleb Hudson of Worcester County, has been committed and is now confined in the jail of said County, charged with the murder of Isaac Hudson son of his Master, and that the purposes of justice require that he should be brought to trial before the regular term of Worcester County Court, by a special commission of Oyer and Terminer and general jail delivery was issued directed to William Bond Martin Esquire chief Judge and Ara Spence and William Tingle Esquires associate Judges of the fourth Judicial district of this State, authorizing and requiring the said Judges to hold a Court at Snow Hill in Worcester County aforesaid, on Monday the twenty third instant, and from thence by adjournment from day to day as may be found necessary for the trial of the said Negro Bob or Robert, and all other crimes, offences or misdemeanors whatsoever that have arisen or may arise in the said County, and for the delivery of the jail of the said County of all the prisoners confined therein, charged with any crime offence or misdemeanor whatsoever. April 10th 1827.

Richard Henry Douglass Esquire of the City of Baltimore, having this day produced to His Excellency the Governor, an Exequatur, from the President of the United States, recognizing him as Consul of His Majesty the King of Saxony for the Port of Baltimore in this State. His Excellency ordered that the said act of recognition be published once a week for three weeks in the Maryland Republican Gazette and Carrolltonian at Annapolis; the Patriot American Gazette at Baltimore; Political Examiner at Frederick Town; Maryland Herald at Hagerstown; Star at Easton and National Intelligencer.
