John Quincy Adams, President of the United States of America, to all whom it may concern.

Richard Henry Douglass having produced to me his commission as Consul of His Majesty the King of Spain for the Port of Baltimore in the State of Maryland, I do hereby recognize him as such, and declare him free to exercise and enjoy such functions, powers and privileges, as are allowed to Consuls of the most favored Nations, in the United States.

April 13th 1827

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to a certain Richard D. Wheeler of Baltimore County, for assaulting and castrating a free negro man named John, for which an Indictment was pending against him in Baltimore County Court. (See Parson Record)

His Excellency also granted a Pardon to a certain William Leach for a "Felony" for which he was convicted in Prince Georges County Court at April Term Instant, and for which he was sentenced to two years confinement in the Penitentiary and to make restitution of the property stolen, or five dollars the value thereof. (See Parson Record)

April 14th 1827

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to a certain William Fox Booth, alias, William Booth for "stealing swine, sheep the property of Micajah Merriman, and also for stealing six sheep the property of Ephraim Wilson" for which he was convicted in Baltimore County Court at April Term Instant. April 23rd 1827

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to a certain James Callahan for an assault and battery on Joseph
