On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor and by and with the advice and consent of the Council, Joseph Townsend, John Keiler, George Decker, and William Meeter Esquires of the City of Baltimore, and Elias Babary, Doctor Thomas Johnson and John Buck (of Benjamin) Esquires, of Baltimore County, were appointed "the Visitors and Governors of the Jail of Baltimore County," by virtue of an act of the General Assembly, entitled, "An act to appoint a Warden for the jail of Baltimore County," passed at December Session 1826.

The several and respective Bonds of Dennis Boyd, Samuel Tyler and Richard H. Hall, for the faithful performance of their respective duty as Inspectors of Tobacco at the State Warehouse, were this day examined and approved by the Governor and Council, and bonded to be recorded amongst the records of Baltimore County Court, according to Law.

His Excellency the Governor granted a full Pardon to Jacob Richardson of Queen Anne's County, on account of an Indictment pending against him in Queen Anne's County Court, charging him with having on the 29th day of October 1822, absconded with a certain Richard Houghtlett with an intent to kill (See Pardon Record)

His Excellency also granted a Pardon to a certain William White on account of stealing Sultry Bank Notes, of which he has been convicted in Anne Arundel County Court at April Term last, and sentenced therefor to the Penitentiary for two years. (See Pardon Record)
