Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Daniel Martin Esquire or order one hundred and twenty five dollars for one quarters salary as a member of the Council due the first ultimo.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay William McChien or order fifty eight dollars viz \$2 for advertising for proposals for delivering the Laws and Votes and proceedings, \$4 for advertising for proposals for printing the Laws, \$18 for printing Books Blank for the Executive, \$30 for printing 500 Blank for the Auditor General and \$4 for one year subscription to the Carrolltonian

His Excellency the Governor, this day granted a Nolle Prosequi to a certain Mary Malloy in account of an indictment against her in Baltimore City Court, charging her with receiving a stolen Bank Note knowing the same to have been stolen. (see pardon Record)

His Excellency also granted a Nolle Prosequi to a certain James Hunt on account of two several indictments pending against him in Baltimore County Court, charging him with keeping a gaming Table. (see pardon Record)
