

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Joseph Wagon or order four dollars for trimming the floor chairs in the State House Hall; amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or order thirty dollars and eighty cents for Stationery for recording the various papers under contract with the Executive by virtue of Resolutions of the General Assembly; amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Jeremiah Hughes or order eighty eight dollars eighty eight cents, viz. \$4 for publishing Proclamation of Congressional Election; \$2 for advertising for proposals for printing the Laws, \$1 for advertising for proposals for distributing the Laws; \$3 for publishing recognition of Mr. 16 Douglas as Honor Consul; \$30 for copies of many Documents of the Executive; \$11.88 for Stationery for the Executive and \$15 for three year subscription to his paper; amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Thomas Perrin Smith or order sixty eight dollars viz. \$38.75 for publishing and providing for Primary Schools, \$18.75 for publishing acts providing for alterations of the Constitution, \$3 for publishing recognition of A. C. Hovickin as Consul, \$3.50 for publishing Proclamation of Benjamin Buckenaster, \$3 for publishing Proclamation of Congressional Election, and \$1 for advertising for proposals to deliver the Laws &c. amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Jonas Green or order five hundred dollars on account of printing the Laws of the last Session of the General Assembly to be accounted for.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or order one hundred dollars on account of distributing the Laws and Proceedings to be accounted for.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Thomas Harris and Reuben Johnson Esquires or their order seven hundred and fifty dollars for one hundred and twenty five copies of the first Volume of Harris & Johnson's Reports, purchased by virtue of a Resolution of the General Assembly.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Nolle Prosequi to a certain French Sparring on account of a charge against him for Stealing for which he was committed to the jail of Prince Georges County by Edward M. Belt Esquire, a Justice of the Peace of the said County.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or order forty six dollars and two cents for the purchase of firewood to be accounted for.

May 16th 1827

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Betty Shinn or order thirteen dollars and fifty cents for six months salary for cleaning the public Temple, due on the first instant.
