

Wednesday July 4th 1827

His Excellency the Governor attended in the Council Chamber.

His Excellency this day granted a Pardon to a certain William Seymour alias William C. Moore for Murder in the second degree in killing and Betsy Bodley a free woman of colour, of which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court at June Term 1826, and sentenced to the Penitentiary for fifteen years. (See Pardon Record)

His Excellency also granted a Nolle Prosequi to a certain Peter Swinley of Frederick County on account of a charge against him of selling goods as a Hawker and pedlar, without license. (See Pardon Record)

July 7th 1827

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Thomas Culbreth or order three hundred and seventy five dollars for one quarter salary as Clerk of the Council due the first Instant.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Joseph Gallop or order one hundred and twenty five dollars for one quarter salary as a member of the Council due the first Instant.

July 9th 1827

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to a certain Robert Dell, on account of a Felony of which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court at February Term 1827. (See Pardon Record)

His Excellency also granted a Pardon to a certain Edward Martin on account of Burglary and of two several cases of Felony of which he was convicted in Baltimore City Court at November Term 1818, and for which he was sentenced to five years confinement in the Penitentiary for each of the said offenses, making in all fifteen years. (See Pardon Record)

July 14th 1827

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to a certain John R. Atkinson on account of forging counterfeit Bank Notes of which he was convicted in six several cases in Baltimore City Court at June Term last. (See Pardon Record)

July 16th 1827

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thompson or order fifty dollars for balance due him for delivering the Laws and Notes and proceedings of the last General Assembly to the Clerks of the several Counties in the Western Shore of contract, after deducting one hundred dollars advanced him on that account.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Henry Thomp, or order one hundred and twelve dollars fifty cents for one quarter salary as a member of the Council due the first Instant.
