is not committed to your custody, for any offence against the Laws of this State: he the  
said agent paying all costs of the arrest, imprisonment &c of the said Elijah Morry.  
From which they shall be your sufficient Warrant.

The State of Maryland to wit. Whereas, in compliance with a demand  
of His Excellency John Andrew Shultz Governor of the State of Pennsylvania, order  
has been given for the surrender of a certain Elijah Morry, a fugitive from  
the Justice of the said State of Pennsylvania, to William Nixon agent duly appointed  
to receive the said fugitive and transport him back to the said State of Pennsylv-  
vania: it appearing from authentic documents, certified and transmitted to the  
Executive department of this State, that the said Elijah Morry stands charged  
with the crime of Horse Stealing alleged to have been committed in the County of  
Franklin in the said State. Now, therefore, I Joseph Kent Governor of the State  
of Maryland, do hereby require and enjoin all persons within this State to  
let the said William Nixon agent as aforesaid pass with the said fugitive  
unmolested to the said State of Pennsylvania: he the said William Nixon  
conducting himself in a peaceable and orderly manner, and using no improper  
severity or cruelty in his treatment of the said prisoner.
