Ridgate or order thirty dollars for going to Annapolis to procure the funds necessary to the execution of the Verdict of the Jury in Sugans Appeal from the decision of the Commissioners appointed under Act of December Session 1826 Chap 250.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Lawson & Townsend contractor with the Executive for building & also inspection Warehouse in the City of Baltimore, or order two thousand five hundred dollars, to be accounted for.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay William Gwynne or order eighteen dollars, viz \$5.00 for advertising proposals for Land, \$2 for publishing recognition of Laram Consul, \$2 for publishing Proclamation of Amos Jacobs, \$5.00 for publishing Valuation of Property on Sugans Wharf, \$2 for publishing recognition of the Swedish Consul.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Peter Force or order twenty dollars for subscription to the Daily National Journal from 2nd March 1826 to 2nd March 1828, & amount allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Jeremiah Hughes or order one hundred and sixty four dollars viz \$114 for printing blanks for Treasurers and Executive and \$30 for extra copies of the Executive Messages and Documents, & account allowed.
