

By the Petition of Arthur Selby of Prince Georges County accompanied by a transcript from the Records of the County Court of said County it appears that he was fined by the said Court at October Term 1826 sixteen dollars for keeping an Ordinary without License. The Petitioner states that some time in the Month of February 1826 he commenced keeping an Ordinary in a Court which he rented of a certain James Edmonston, who then had a License from said County Court, that was in force until the next April Term, that there was an understanding between said Edmonston and the Petitioner, that he the Petitioner should conduct said Ordinary under the authority of the License aforesaid until the next Court, that believing himself fully authorized under the License aforesaid, he continued to keep the said Ordinary until the sitting of the said Court. He therefore prays for a remission of the said fine. And the Court having recommended a compliance with the prayer he do hereby remit the said fine.

On the nomination of His Excellency the Governor, and by and with the advice and consent of the Council, the following Civil appointment was made and Commission issued, accordingly viz.

Young Osbey Inspector of Tobacco at Plum Point Warehouse in Calvert County.

His Excellency the Governor, this day granted a full Pardon to a certain Marcy Fountain, on account of a charge of feloniously selling two negro Girls Fanny and Eliza, which were entitled to freedom which was pending against him in Caroline County Court. (See Pardon Record)

Captain Ephraim White's Bond for the safe keeping and return of seventy five Rifles complete, heretofore loaned to Captain William Crosby, formerly Commander of the Company now commanded by said Captain White, was approved and accepted in lieu of Captain Crosby's Bond, which was thereupon cancelled, and the following order issued viz.

Ordered that Major William Crosby deliver to Captain Ephraim White, the seventy five Rifles complete, heretofore loaned him for the use of the Company now commanded by the said White.
