By the Petition of Ipe Pugh of Allegany County, accompanied by a transcript from the Records of the County Court of said County, it appears, that he was fined by the said County Court, at April Term last, fifty dollars for an assault and Battery.

The Petitioner states that Buchanan, the person in whom the assault and Battery was alleged to have been committed, is partially of unsound mind, and in the habit of taking Horses fastened in the Street or elsewhere, as he can find them, and riding them off, without knowing when to stop, unless overtaken by a pursuer; that said Buchanan took possession of and mounted a beautiful and valuable Animal of the Petitioner, on or about the 10th day of July last, and so used and rode the same that on the same day the creature died from the effects of the ride; that on or about the 12th day of July last, said Buchanan mounted another Horse, without leave of the owner, in the Street of Old Town, manifesting a determination to ride away, that he the said Petitioner from a knowledge of what had happened only two days preceding, approached said Buchanan, and with a view to save the Horse laid hands upon him and took him from off the Horse, that it was in the struggle which ensued, growing out of this occurrence, that the assault and Battery was alleged to have been committed. The Petitioner further states that he is a poor man dependent exclusively upon his bodily exertions for the means of subsistence for himself and family. He therefore prays for a remission of the said fine. And sundry respectable Citizens of the said County, having recommended a compliance with his prayer, we do hereby remit the said fine.
