

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to a certain James White, on account of an assault and Battery of which he was convicted in Anne Arundel County Court, at April Term, last, and for which he was sentenced to thirty days imprisonment. (See Pardon Record).

His Excellency also, this day, granted to a certain Jacob Ball, who was convicted in Baltimore County Court at March Term 1828 of Murder in the first degree, "a commutation of the punishment to which he is subject by Law, to fifteen years confinement in the Penitentiary." (See Pardon Record).

His Excellency also, this day, granted to a certain Thomas Hatfield a Pardon on account of three several assaults and Batteries of which he was convicted in Baltimore County Court, at September Term 1827, and for which he was sentenced to six months imprisonment, in each case. (See Pardon Record)

His Excellency also, this day, granted a Nolle Prosequi to a certain Mary Ann Ray, on account of an assault and Battery on the body of Caroline Bailey, pending against him by presentment, in Talbot County Court. (See Pardon Record)

His Excellency also, this day, granted a Nolle Prosequi to a certain Edmund M. Love, on account of four several assaults and Batteries charged against him by presentment, in Talbot County Court. (See Pardon Record)

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Washington G. Cook or order one hundred and eighty eight dollars twenty five cents, for cleaning and repairing Army, under Resolution of the General Assembly, & account allowed. (See Pardon Record)

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Washington G. Cook or order one hundred and two dollars, viz \$80 for making Bibles for the Laws and Votes and proceedings, \$6 for carrying Army, \$3.50 for opening Bibles and carrying Army in the Armory and \$12.50 for one quarter salary for taking care of the public property, during the last term. Account allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay James Green or order two hundred and sixty one dollar for printing Bibles for the Adjutant General, & account allowed.

Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay Joseph Mayo or order one hundred and fifty dollars for recording necessary papers.
