The Petitioner states, that he was met on the public Road by the said Richard Jacobs, and his father John Jacobs, and was there beaten by the said Richard Jacobs in a cruel and outrageous manner, in the presence of the said John Jacobs, which circumstances he was unable to prove to the Court, that he was rescued from the hands of the said Jacobs, by Doctor John Ridgely, who, incidentally came up at the moment, and who is a signer to this petition. He therefore prays to be released from the said fine, and sundry respectable citizens of Anne Arundel County, having recommended a compliance with the prayer of the Petitioner, we do hereby remit the said fine.

By the Petition of James B. Dixon late Sheriff of Calvert County, accompanied by a transcript from the Records of the County Court of the said County, it appears, that he was fined by the said Court, at October Term 1826, twenty dollars for failing to bring into the said Court the body of Elisha Buckmaster, and twenty dollars for failing to bring into the said Court, <sup>the body</sup> of Nelson Coster, agreeably to his returns. The Petitioner states, that in consequence of circumstances over which he had no control, he was unable to bring into Court the body of the said Buckmaster, and Coster, at the time fixed for their trial, and consequently, was fined as aforesaid, but that he afterwards brought them into Court, and that they were tried for the respective offenses with which they were charged. He therefore prays, that as the administration of Justice was not finally impeded, he may be released from the said fines. And the Court having recommended a compliance with his prayer, we do hereby remit the said fines.

By the Petition of Thomas M<sup>d</sup> Baden of Prince Georges County, accompanied by transcripts from the Records of the County Court, of said County, it appears, that he has been fined by the said Court, in three several cases, the sum of sixteen dollars in each case, for selling liquor without License. The Petitioner states, that in the month of November 1826, he opened a Grocery Store, in Prince Georges County, that at the time he was about to commence retailing business of an important character called him to Baltimore, and that when he was about leaving
