Ordered that the Treasurer of the Western Shore, pay Daniel Martin Esquire or his order two hundred and fifty dollars for six months salary as a member of the Council due the last instant.

William A. Lambdin Esquire's Bond for the faithful performance of his duty as Treasurer of the Eastern Shore, being laid before the board, was examined and approved, and ordered to be recorded in Talbot County Court as required by Law.

On the return of the Deaf and Dumb, in the City of Baltimore being received, and a petition from Jacob Workinger, the father of William Workinger one of the said Deaf and Dumb, praying the benefits of the act passed at the last Session of the General Assembly, providing for the Education of the indigent Deaf and Dumb of this State, in favor of the said William Workinger, His Excellency the Governor granted the prayer of the petitioner, and directed that the said William Workinger be sent to the Pennsylvania Institution, to receive the benefits of Education as provided by the said act.
