

On the Nomination of His Excellency the Governor, and by and with the
advice and Consent of the Council, Henry Lankford Esquire was re-appointed
Clerk of Somerset County, having failed to give bond in the time required by Law,
and Commission issued to him accordingly.

Ordered that the Bond given by Plinar [unclear] to secure the payment
of Prizes in the Lottery authorized for the benefit of St. Johns and Washington
Colleges, respectively, be recorded as directed by Law, the first in Anne Arundel, and
the other in Kent County Court.

Ordered that Washington of St. Michaels, Armorer at Annapolis,
sell all the tents in the said Armoury, eight shot Axes, four old spades, one old
Flag, a Lot of Hammers, Nails, Axes, Cart-wheels and Collars, for Cash, after
giving ten days public notice.

His Excellency the Governor, this day granted a full Pardon to
certain John M. Combs, on account of "Homicide" with which he was charged
and a Warrant against him issued by a Justice of the Peace of Maryland County.
