Sir,
 On the second Instant, I made a demand upon your Excellency
 for the surrender of Henry Dick, the slave of Eliza Beatty Squire of Washington
 County, as a fugitive from the Justice of this State, and in former part that I had appointed
 the said Eliza Beatty Squire my agent to receive the said fugitive and bring him
 into this State. Mr. Beatty, having declined to act as agent, I have appointed
 Henry Treaner, Gentleman and one of the Constables of Washington County, in his place,
 to whom you will please cause the said fugitive to be delivered.

His Excellency the Governor this day granted a Pardon to
 a certain Daniel Morgan on account of Stealing of which he was
 convicted in Baltimore City Court, on the fifth day of June 1823, and for which
 he was sentenced to the Penitentiary for seven years. The said Pardon granted
 upon condition of the said Morgan leaving the United States within twenty
 days from the date thereof, and not returning within any of the United
 States for five years (See Pardon Record).
