By the petition of Anne Barber of George's Anne Arundel County, it appears that he was fined by the County Court, said County, at October Term last, the sum of twenty five dollars for an assault alleged to have been committed on one John Harby. The Petitioner states that the person upon whom the said assault is stated to have been committed, is a Soldier in the Garrison of Fort Severn, and that his only object to prove his innocence was the partner of his bosom, who, in consequence, as he believes, of the outrage (which induced the prosecution, and in consequence of which the said fine was imposed) was severely afflicted and his wife died.

He states that he is totally innocent of having committed a breach of the peace, and that even supposing he had the conduct of the prosecutor towards an un-protected female, in his absence, would have fully justified him; but disclaiming all intention of violating the Laws of the Land, he prays a remission of the said fine. And sundry respectable citizens of the said County, having recommended a compliance with the prayer of the petitioner, we do hereby remit the said fine.
